The boxes on this worksheet represent the eight houses situated nearest to you. Although your neighborhood may not look like this, the eight boxes represent the eight closest neighbors to your house or apartment. Fill out the three subpoints within each box:

- 1. Write the names of the people who live in the house represented by the box. Write down first and last names, if you know them. If you only know first names, that's OK for now.
- 2. Write down what you know about each person in that household. These would be things that you would know if you've spoken to the person a couple of times. This would be things like 'grew up in Alabama' or 'is a architect, plays tennis, had a father in the Korean War.'
- 3. Write down some in-depth information that you would know after connecting with them over time. This may be their future career or vacation plans, dreams of starting a family or anything that has to do with the purpose of their lives. What motivates what they do? What would they say about God? What do they most fear? Write down anything meaningful you've learned through interacting with them.
